The speaker himself was minus a limb and he had such a wonderful personality. Committee Member Wilfried Winkler was assisting that evening. He found the speech personally interesting, as his daughter is an amputee herself and has been selected for the Australian Team, to represent Australia at the Paralympics.

addition, Fred Csar copied - for our visitors - an article from the "Burgenländische Gemeinschaft" featuring "Franz Liszt Year 2011". Anniversary celebrations commenced in Burgenland on January 27th this year.

Fred wanted everyone to know that Burgenland has something to be very proud of. Liszt composed five oratorios; Masses; psalms; a requiem and orchestral works. These piano works, numbering around the 250 pieces, made him famous all over the world. It was the Hungarian Rhapsodies especially, which contributed to his fame and popularity. The best known of these rhapsodies was used by Charlie Chaplin in the film "The Dictator", when he - as a hairdresser - shaved a customer while listening to the rhapsody...

Sadly we heard of the death of Poldi Mair on 26th June. Our thoughts are with Walter; they had been together for a notable 67 years. Poldi was in our midst only recently, taking out, as she had done year after year, the prize as oldest mother in the Club on Mother's Day.

On Wednesday 29th June the Rotary Club of Rosanna celebrated their changing over of Presidents. Our Club benefited with a donation of \$1,000, for which we are very grateful.

Since our last Newsletter there have been many parties held in the Club. We find that someone attends a party as a guest and then they often come back to organise a party for themselves. Thank you to Karl Mitterlehner for his generous donation of a swing for the playground. Our playground is a big hit with the children that come to the parties held at the Club.

On Monday 11th July Beverly and I attended a chamber recital by the "Acies" String Quartet at the Duldig Studio. After the concert we had the opportunity to explore the venue - an authentic "house museum" and a strong link between Melbourne and Vienna.

Due to price increases from \$3 to \$4 per kg, effective 1st March, for Frankfurts, Debreziner, Leberkase and Beef the Management Committee found it necessary to increase some of the meal prices by 50c. We trust that you understand. In addition to food increases there have been many other price increases: linen by 8% is the heaviest, then there is waste pick up, as well as wages which are up by 3.4% as of 1st July.

The Management Committee also found it necessary to increase admittance charges for Guests at a Standard Function. The guest entry fee will increase from \$5 to \$10 per person, effective as of 1st July 2011. Members of the Club will still be admitted free.

In this Newsletter there is the notice of the Annual General Meeting, to be held on Sunday 18th September 2011. Please mark this date in your diary - it is a very important meeting which all members should attend. This is your Club and for this reason you should be present and involved with all the important decisions for the future.

Lastly I do wish to say a big thank you to all the Committee Members and Volunteers who pitch in to keep everything running smoothly. Without the assistance of these people the Club would find it very difficult to operate on a daily basis or even stay in business.

Seit unserem letzten Mitteilungsblatt wurden viele Parties in unserem Klub abgehalten. Wir finden daß ein Gast der zu einer Party eingeladen wurde, später oft selbst eine Party arrangiert. Besten Dank an Karl Mitterlehner, der großzügig eine Schaukel für den Spielplatz spendierte. Unser Spielplatz ist bei den Kindern die an den Parties teilnehmen immer beliebt.

Am 11. Juli nahmen Beverly und ich an einem Kammerkonzert teil, daß vom "Acies" Streichquartett im Duldig Studio vorgetragen wurde. Nach dem Konzert hatten wir die Gelegenheit uns am Schauplatz umzusehen - ein authentisches "Hausmuseum" sowie eine starke Verbindung zwischen Melbourne und Wien.

Neue Preiserhöhungen die am 1. März in Kraft traten und somit das Kilo von \$3 auf \$4 erhöhten sehen uns gezwungen, manche Mahlzeiten um 50c zu erhöhen. Das betrifft Frankfurter, Debreziner, Leberkäse und Rindfleisch. Wir hoffen auf ihr Verständnis. Im Zusatz zu Esswaren stiegen auch viele andere Preise: die Preiserhöhung der Tischwäsche war mit 8% am radikalsten, ebenfalls Abfallbeseitigung, sowie Löhne die am 1. Juli bei 3.4% anstiegen.

Zusätzlich fand es das Komitee notwendig die Eintrittspreise zu erhöhen. Bei einer Standard Veranstaltung erhöhte sich für Gäste der Eintritt seit dem 1. Juli 2011 von \$5 auf \$10 für jede Person. Den Mitgliedern wird weiterhin freier Einlass gewährt.

In diesem Nachrichtenblatt ist ein Hinweis auf unsere Jahreshauptversammlung, die am Sonntag den 18. September stattfindet. Bitte vermerkt dieses Datum auf eurem Kalender, denn es ist ein sehr wichtiges Zusammenkommen, wobei alle Mitglieder zugegen sein sollten. Es ist euer Klub und genau deshalb solltet ihr bei wichtigen Entscheidungen für die Zukunft des Klubs aktiv dabei sein.

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Bärenjäger Birne

Ingredients (2 portions)

2	Pears
250ml	water
2 Tblsp	Honey
6	Cloves
1/2	Cinnamon stick
20ml	Baerenjaeger Honey Liqueur
80ml	Cream
2	Strawberry
4	Mint leaves
1	Cherry
4	marzipan bees (or flowers)
30gm	Toffee crunch

Method:

- Peel and trim top and bottom of pear to stand the body of the pear straight and vertical.
- Slice each pear into 3 pieces.
- Core out the stem and the seeds.
- Use turning knife to round the edges of the pear rings to emulate beehive rings.

- Place pear pieces and off-cuts in stewing pot with water, cinnamon, cloves and honey.
- Bring water to boil and turn down to simmer with lid on.
- When pears are soft, take lid off and allow liquid to simmer down.
- Turn off heat when liquid is nearly the consistency of honey and cover pot with lid.
- Whip cream.
- Halve strawberries, and cut each into fine slices (3-4) to spin on plate as garnish.
- Cut cherry in half and make it look like a heart.
- Place each pear onto separate plates (re-build back into the shape of beehives).
- Pour 5ml of Baerenjaeger into center of each pear.
- Pour stewing juices through a sieve into cup to remove spices and offcut pieces.
- Mix remaining Baerenjaeger with cup of stewing juices.
- Pour half the cup of syrup over pears and plate.
- Sprinkle Toffee crunch over plate liquid and pear.
- Quinell a double table spoon of whipped cream on plate.
- Place 2 mint leaves on cream.
- Place a cherry half on the cream.
- Fan out the two strawberry halves on plate.
- Place a marzipan bee on the top of pear beehive and 1 on the edge of the liquid.
- Lay 2 stars on edge of each plate and serve.

Tuile Star

Ingredients

40gm	Castor Sugar
32gm	Butter
1	Egg white
1/2 tsp	Honey
40gm	Plain Flour

Gen 1:1
Rev 22:21

Method:

- Mix butter and caster sugar until white.
- Add egg white and honey.
- Fold in flour.
- Smear into 4 stars of a silicone rubber mold with pallet knife. (or smear 1-2mm thick on silicone tray with template)
- Place into warm oven (>130oC) for 8 minutes or until golden brown.
- When cool, remove from silicone mold and serve.
