Editorial

The Bible states, “Where there is no vision, the people perish” (Proverbs 29:18).

Sadly, today there is too much vision. Not the vision the Bible is talking about, of course, but television, computer vision, internet vision, billboard vision, magazine vision, and on it goes.

The wrong vision can be just as deadly as the lack of vision spoken of by Solomon.

Earlier this month we read in the newspaper of two boys in Britain, just 10 and 11, who badly beat and slashed two boys aged 11 and 9.

In the same newspaper we were told children, boys as young as 7 and 8, were caught smashing school windows and damaging a classroom.

What causes children to turn violent and destructive? It is one thing to throw a tantrum at 7, or even 10, but smashing up the school or using a knife to slash another child?

That sort of behaviour should be ringing warning bells. It immediately raises the question, “What are we doing to cause our children that much distress”?

Perhaps the answer is the visions our children and young people are confronted with every day.

As if to give the answer, but without even coming close to tying the two together, there in the same newspaper was the headline “Abortion web site angers parents”. This is about a web site designed for 10 - 12 year olds but accessible to any child. A web site about sex with no values attached, just information - very graphic and suggestive. It states that sex can be just for fun, you don't have to love someone, and you decide when you're ready for it. It even suggests an

average size for male sex organs!!! To read more and to take action see page 4.

Is it just possible this is the sort of ‘vision’ that so messes with children’s minds that it creates the sort of anger the children above displayed?

The reason given for this and other ‘sex education’ initiatives is that society is so sexualised today. Yes, children are confronted with adults behaving badly and scantily clad women on advertisements and growing violence and casual sex on TV and now the addition of very sexualised heroes in animated computer games. All created by adults. Adults with agendas.

The decline started a long time ago, and we did not see it coming. Children were confronted by violent Ninja Turtles and transformer toys (which may have seemed harmless) and the slim very-well-proportioned *Barbie* became the image for young girls to aspire to. These images have changed, subtly at first but then more overtly. It is what it sets in motion that is dangerous, even if the initial ‘hero’ seemed harmless enough.

This month we have seen a lesbian liaison developing on *Home & Away*, a program now swamped with adult themes, including sex and drugs, nightly at 7pm. It should be no surprise that the writer of this program is a homosexual. It has also now surfaced that the creator of *Barbie* was a sex addict.

Clearly it is not the children’s fault, but rather than censor the adults we now have to desensitise and sexualise the children.

We know the church should be the answer but does it care enough to speak out? It is happy to talk about the poor, refugees, and justice, but is it prepared to swim against the tide of Political Correctness and challenge the demeaning of our children?

Prescription for raising children

A study by the **Mapping America** project has found that children have fewer behaviour problems when they live with both biological parents and attend religious services frequently.^{1,2}

“Children who worship at least weekly are least likely to have their parents contacted by school teachers or administrators about school-related problems,” the report said.²

Those who live with both parents and frequently attend religious services are five times less likely to repeat a grade, and more likely to be cooperative and understanding of others’ feelings.

The data were collected from a survey sample of 102,353 children and teens aged 6 through 17 in all US States. This sample represented nearly 49 million young people nationwide.

It was announced that: “Parents of these children report less stress, healthier parent-child relationships, and fewer concerns about their children’s achievement. These differences hold up even after controlling for family income and poverty, low parent education levels, and race and ethnicity.”¹

There’s a very good reason for the researchers emphasizing that point. That’s because, as the report points out:

“Some social scientists even contend that family structure and religious participation are only linked to developmental outcomes because of their association with socioeconomic disparities.”²

This report, however, dispels that notion - a notion popularly proclaimed by the world’s secular media. The report shows that the positive impact of living with both

parents, coupled with regular attendance at worship services, just cannot be ignored. For example, when displaying a bar graph comparing percentages of children who repeat a grade, the authors of the report were unequivocal in their language (emphasis added) when they said:

“Children from intact families who worship frequently are least likely to repeat a grade. Note the **dramatic difference between intact and non-intact families.**”²

That would hardly be a surprise to anyone who knows what the Bible says about families. The biological family is God’s prescription for the proper and best way of raising children. The fact that in the beginning God made but one man and one woman shows that He intended that

marriage should be monogamous and indissoluble (Genesis 2:18; Matthew 19:3-9 (citing Genesis 1:27 and 2:24 as real history written by the Creator); see also <creation.com/monogamy>). And it is within this setting that God blessed the world’s first parents and said, “Be fruitful and increase in number . . .” (Genesis 1:28). Cf. “Children are a heritage of the Lord” (Psalm 127:3-5).

One purpose of God in instituting families is seen in God’s instructions to parents to teach their children about God and His Word (Deuteronomy 4:10, 6:6-7), in order to produce “godly offspring” (Malachi 2:15). When parents follow the Manufacturer’s instructions it is little wonder that these children have a huge advantage.



The Mapping America project report, however, includes this somewhat sobering snapshot of young America:

“Despite the developmental advantages associated with an intact two-parent family and religious training, the survey shows that nowadays less than half of all American children between 6 and 17 years of age - 45 percent - live with both biological parents and attend religious services weekly or monthly.”²

In the Bible, one of the roles of the prophets preparing for the coming of Christ, was “to turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers” (Malachi 4:6 (NIV)). Luke, quoting this verse adds, “to turn

the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to make ready a people prepared for the Lord” (Luke 1:17).

There could be a message there for today’s parents!

Valueless web based sex information for 10-12 year olds!!

The Hormone Factory is an interactive sex education web site aimed at 10 – 12 year olds. It gained newspaper coverage this month - that report focused on it being endorsed by the Queensland Education Department for primary school children.

We have now discovered that in fact it is being promoted in other states and even internationally. It was designed by La Trobe University Faculty of Health Science.

We found links to the site on the Tasmanian Govt. youth site *LinkZone* and the Victorian Govt. ‘*Better Health*’ web site.

The promoters talk about parents and teachers being involved but there are no barriers to access. In fact the introduction states “Are you aged 10 to 12? This site is for you. If you want to know how babies are made, click a fuzzy hormone at the top to find out more...”

The *Better Health* site tells parents “Use the Internet - log onto a good website, like *The Hormone Factory*, and let your child browse alone.” The Tasmanian government

Linkzone site, designed by their Office of Children and Youth Affairs, states... “This fun site has information for 10 to 12 year olds on stuff like periods, girls’ bits, boys’ bits, puberty and making babies.”

Sadly, this site is not new: the ABC program *Life Matters* reported on it on 6 August 2002, but it seems to have gone under the radar until now.

What is all the fuss about?

This site tells the reader, “You told us you were 11... It is normal for you to be interested in this stuff [pornography] at this age.”

When talking of abortion it states “It can also be a relief.”

When talking about AIDS, it does NOT mention it can be fatal, nor does it mention that in Australia AIDS is mostly (about 80%) caused through male-male anal sex (homosexuality).

Other examples of the valueless nature of this site are summed up in the following

questions and answers.

Question: "When to have sex?"

Answer: "It is important that a person feels ready, safe, happy and old enough."

Q: "Decisions"

A: While the answer does give love and marriage as options, it also states...

"Some people have sex because they like having sex and don't need to be in love."

Q: "Termination"

A: "Sometimes people find they are pregnant and do not want to have a baby. They might decide to go to a doctor and have an operation to end the pregnancy. This is called a termination, or an abortion.

"Having a termination is a hard decision to make, and can be very sad. It can also be a relief. If a woman has a termination she can still have a baby at another time."

NOTE: This site does not mention that there can be adverse consequences from an abortion.

This site also says, "It is normal to be gay, lesbian, or bisexual, or heterosexual."

NOTE: They put heterosexual LAST!

Then there is this gem of ambiguity, "Research in Australia says that about half of all 18 year olds have had sex. But more 18 year olds have not had sex."

'About half do, but more don't' - is that confusing? Perhaps that's because I am not 10 years old! But what is a 10 year old meant to make of such a statement?

Adults have sexualised our society for decades and that sexualisation is now being used as the 'reason' to sexualise our children and grandchildren.

La Trobe University, creators of this site,

have, for some years, been sexualising our children by doing school-based research on sexual activity/attitudes and promoting their somewhat skewed results as evidence of increasing sexual activity.

We all know that sexual activity among young people has increased and this is due to many factors, but the more it is researched through questioning children about intimate details of their sexual activity, and the more it is 'taught' as OK through school-based sex-ed, and web sites like this one, the more it becomes true.

Inviting children to use an interactive web site like *The Hormone Factory* will mess further with immature minds.

ACTION:

Please write to your State Education minister and Opposition Education Minister.

Ask them to remove recommendations and links to this web site.

Ask that they pressure La Trobe uni to remove the site from the internet.

Tell them that sexualising our children with this information at 10 - 12 years of age is nothing less than child abuse.

Companies & same-sex 'marriages'

Westpac has told homosexual lobby group **Australian Marriage Equality (AME)** that it will recognise same-sex 'marriages'. AME has established a register of companies that have agreed to recognise same-sex 'marriages' - these include Telstra, Qantas, IBM, ANZ and the Commonwealth Bank. The companies have agreed to extend the same partner benefits and entitlements to all employees and not discriminate against those in same-sex relationships.

Since they refer to 'marriage' one presumes they mean marriages that have been performed overseas in jurisdictions that allow them. AME says the companies "grant full recognition to the same-sex marriages of their employees and customers and do not reclassify these marriages as domestic partnerships, de facto relationships or something else that they are not."

AME's list of companies recognising same-sex 'marriages' is at <http://www.australianmarriageequality.com/employers.htm> NOW AME is lobbying for the federal government to recognise the same-sex 'marriages' of its employees!

ACTION: Please write to these companies, especially if you do business with them (check the list online for more). Ask them not to recognise same-sex 'marriages' since the Australian government has, at present, refused to grant legal recognition of overseas same-sex 'marriages'.

Ask why they are going against the laws of this nation and undermining the government's position.

Drinking for teens

Recently we heard the statement 'We got it wrong'! AT LAST, we might well say!

Researchers at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute in Melbourne have announced that there is NO safe level of drinking alcohol for teenagers. This runs counter to the current national guidelines that say that there is a 'low-level risk' for teens drinking small amounts. The research was published in the *Australian and New Zealand Journal of Public Health*.



The result of teen drinking?

The research showed that there are higher rates of alcohol abuse and risky sexual behaviour among those who drink when teenagers.

SA: Cloning Bill passed

The South Australian government has passed a law allowing the creation of embryos in order to destroy them to extract their stem cells.

The vote in the Legislative Council was 12 to 9. The law will also allow the use of animal eggs for the testing of human sperm - the law requires that the hybrid embryos be destroyed after two days. Liberal MP Rob Lucas said he believed most people would find this practice "abhorrent".

As we have recently noted, new research means that stem cells that act in the same way as embryonic stem cells can now be created from adult sources - making the use of embryos not only unethical but unnecessary!

SA: Equal Opportunity Bill

The SA government's Legislative Council has been debating amendments to the state's Equal Opportunity Act. One amendment would have required church schools that did not want to employ homosexual teachers to place their policy on the school's website. Fortunately, the amendment was opposed by Family First and the Liberal Party and was defeated. Debate on the Bill was continuing in mid-April.

Are you 'heterosexist'? Please explain!

Words are often redefined by those using them to promote their particular agenda, so we need to get into the habit of asking, "What do you mean by that?"

A recent report called *Coming Forward*² by a Victorian homosexual 'health' group, funded by the government, repeatedly uses the word 'heterosexist'.

What do they mean by that?

They said the report "uses the term heterosexism to describe the complex social and psychological processes underpinning violence and discrimination against not only gay men, lesbians and bisexuals, but also against transsexuals and transgender people." The report said "Heterosexism assumes that sex, gender and the relationship between the two are fixed at birth. Men are born masculine, women feminine and sexuality is the gendered, reciprocal attraction between the two."

Wait a minute - I thought that's the way things actually are! As Christians we believe that God made man and woman, gave us our unique characteristics and urged them to marry and to be fruitful and multiply. Does that make us all 'heterosexist' if we think that way? They would say, "Yes".

The word 'homophobic' is an old favourite of homosexual activists. Webster's Dictionary dates this word back to 1958!

If we take the actual word *homophobia* and break it up, *homo* means 'man' and *phobia* means 'fear'. But of course that isn't the meaning that those promoting a homosexual agenda want the word to have.

They apply the word to anyone who opposes homosexuality in any way - they usually interpret it to mean 'hate'. They simply don't like people opposing homosexuality, even if they are really nice about it!

Recently the Victorian Equal Opportunity Commission's training officer gave us their definition of 'homophobia'. He told us that it meant 'any aversion or fear of homosexuals or homosexual behaviour.'

Doug Pollard, a homosexual, writing in the homosexual press last month, actually called for an end to the use of the word 'homophobia' because he says people who oppose homosexuality really aren't 'afraid' of homosexuals. BUT he went on to say that, though they might not be 'homophobic' they still 'hate' and have 'prejudice' against them - a claim we reject, so we wrote to him and told him so.

What do you mean by that?

The word 'heterophobia', is also used quite often. Professor Ray Noonan, in his 1999 presentation to *The Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality* said "The term heterophobia is confusing for some people for several reasons. On the one hand, some look at it as just another of the many me-too social constructions that have arisen in the pseudoscience of victimology in recent decades. . . Others look at the parallelism between heterophobia and homophobia, and suggest that the former trivializes the latter. Yet heterophobia may be one of the root contributors in the etiology of homophobia, as Noonan argued in 1998. For others, it is merely a curiosity or parallel-construction word game. But for others still, it is part of both the recognition and politicization of heterosexuals' cultural interests in contrast to those of gays - particularly where those interests are perceived to clash."¹

Confusing, isn't it? So just remember, next time someone uses a word to describe you, ask them, "What do YOU mean by that?"

Sweden and USA: same-sex 'marriage'

Sweden has now become the seventh nation to allow same-sex 'marriage' with the parliament voting to approve a new 'gender-neutral marriage' law. The vote was 261 in favour and 22 opposed, with 70 MPs not voting.

As we mentioned last month, Sweden was one of the first nations to give 'Registered partnerships' to homosexual couples in 1995. That didn't stop the activists - they continued lobbying for "full equality".

In Australia, the group *Australian Marriage Equality* is saying that although they have been given 'civil unions' [their name for relationship registers in Victoria and Tasmania and civil partnerships in the ACT] they still want full marriage.

USA - states change laws

Several states in the USA have now legalised same-sex 'marriage'. There are two ways this is being achieved. In some states the highest court, the Supreme Court, is making a ruling on a case lodged by activists wanting to challenge the law.

California's Supreme Court ruled in May 2008 that same-sex marriage should be legal. This was overturned by Proposition 8, a referendum held on November 2008. Now the case is back before the Supreme Court, with the justices asked to rule on the legality of Proposition 8 and the legality of the 'marriages' performed during 2008.

Iowa - the Iowa Supreme Court issued a unanimous ruling on 3 April. The court found that the state's same-sex marriage ban violates the constitutional rights of homosexuals because the 'equal protection' clause says that all citizens should be given

"equal privileges". The law came into effect on April 24, 2009.

The other method used is through the legislature where new laws are passed to allow same-sex 'marriage'.

Vermont - This was the first US state to legislate to allow 'civil unions'. On December 20, 1999 the Vermont Supreme Court ruled that same-sex couples are "entitled under Chapter I, Article 7, of the Vermont Constitution to obtain the same benefits and protections afforded by Vermont law to married opposite-sex couples". The legislature then voted to allow 'civil unions' - which began in July 2000.

The Vermont legislature has now just voted to approve same-sex 'marriage'. Although the Governor threatened to veto the legislation, the vote in both the House and the Senate was eventually more than the two-thirds majority needed to override the veto. The vote on April 7, 2009 was: Senate 23-5, House 100-49. The law comes into effect on September 1, 2009.

New Hampshire - Civil unions for homosexuals became legal on January 1, 2008. Not content with that, the legislature is currently debating same-sex 'marriage'. The House of Representatives approved the law on March 26, 2009 by 186-179. The Bill now goes to the New Hampshire Senate.

In a number of these cases we have the situation where homosexuals have been granted 'civil unions' or 'registered partnerships' by a nation or a state but homosexual groups have continued to lobby until they get marriage.



Vic: Exceptions to the EO Act

One of the looming battles facing Christians in all States is the removal of exceptions or exemptions for religious belief in the state equal opportunity Acts.

Victoria's Parliament has asked the **Scrutiny of Acts and Regulations Committee (SARC)** to examine the Equal Opportunity Act to see if the exceptions should be altered or removed in light of Victoria's Charter of Rights and Responsibilities.

Of course, the Charter will be seen as the 'superior' document. Of major concern are the exemptions for churches, religious schools and individuals (Sections 75-77).

The Scrutiny of Acts and Regulations Committee has now decided to conduct a public Inquiry. SARC will release an **Interim Report - Options Paper** and call for submissions in May. SARC has engaged

Associate Professor Elizabeth Gaze as the '*consultant*' for the inquiry. This has prompted us to ask some questions: 'Why isn't the Committee running their own Inquiry? Why are they engaging a consultant? Who is Elizabeth Gaze?'



Elizabeth Gaze is an associate professor of law at the University of Melbourne. Her research areas are listed as "Equality and anti-discrimination law with a focus on employment and work-family conflict" and "Comparative equality and human rights laws and their administration".

It is concerning to note that, in her submission to the exceptions review done by the Justice Department, she proposed that the exception for religious schools should be limited and that Section 77, concerning the behaviour of individuals, should also be restricted, "reworded as a proper conscientious objection provision, but one that also takes account of the **effect on the person who is discriminated against.**" [Emphasis added]

Only time will tell how neutral this Inquiry will be! More details next month - we'll also send information on the E-News.

Porn in service stations and milk bars

Have you checked the magazine racks in service stations and milk bars recently?

Over the years we have run many campaigns about displays of pornography in such stores and in newsagents, and asked people to speak to the owners.

Kids Free 2B Kids is concerned about the sexualisation of children. The group has been campaigning for Category 1 pornography to be removed from service stations, convenience stores and milk bars. The group, led by Melbourne mother Julie Gale, is particularly concerned about the availability of pornography containing images of women dressed as girls and looking underage.

Category 1 magazines include explicit nudity and are restricted for sale to people 18 or over - but allowed to be displayed in stores. If the front cover has a restricted image, it must be covered by an opaque wrapper. In November 2008 BP announced they would remove all Category

1 magazines and a week later Shell and Coles Express announced that they would remove similar material.

That's good news - but there are some service stations, and lots of milk bars, and newsagents, that still display and sell Category 1 pornography and pornographic material that is not 'categorised' - including *Picture* and *People* magazines.

ACTION: Please check your local service station, milk bar and newsagent magazine display. Do they display Category 1 pornography? The magazines should have a red diamond with an 'R'. Ask the store NOT to stock these magazines.

If they refuse, ask them, at the very least, to put them, and other pornographic material, at the top of the rack out of sight or reach of children. In some newsagents, we've seen Playboy magazines on the lower racks, visible and accessible to young children.

Update: Home and Away

Channel 7's *Home and Away* showed a lesbian relationship developing between a police woman and another young woman who works on a fishing boat during April. Prior to the episode screening their first kiss, it was reported that Channel 7 had 'censored' the kiss. However, they later said they had filmed two kisses – a short one and a longer one and said they had **decided** to show the short one. The policewoman has had previous boyfriends and is shown as being unsure of her feelings.

The lesbian scenario went on for a number of weeks giving young people very confusing signals about relationships. Eventually it ended in disaster allowing

'homophobia' to be cited as a cause.

As the writer of H & A is a homosexual we wonder how long it will be before the show features a male homosexual 'couple'.

ACTION: Please write to Channel 7, asking them not to show same-sex relationships or unmarried couples sleeping together in *Home and Away*. Seven Network Limited, PO Box 777 Pyrmont NSW 2009. If you wrote to Channel 7 and received a reply – please write to the Australian Communications and Media Authority. Send a copy of the response you received from Channel 7 and explain why you are unhappy with their response and want them to investigate the showing of this relationship in a PG rated programme.



Atheist ads

Around the world there is a proliferation of atheist/humanist ads appearing on buses.

Following a decision to place advertisements on UK buses, similar campaigns have been run in Spain, Italy, Canada and the USA.

Not to be outdone, the **Atheist Foundation of Australia** (AFA) also planned to put ads on buses. Their slogan, “Atheism – sleep in on Sunday mornings”, was rejected by Australia’s biggest outdoor advertising company, APN Outdoor, last November.

The atheists lodged a complaint with the Tasmanian Anti-Discrimination Board and a second complaint with the Victorian Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission for ‘religious discrimination’.

APN said they offered the atheists roadside ads and advertising on billboards - but said that they had no control over ads on buses since the content of such ads was controlled by state bus authorities.

Both cases are still with the authorities, so we’ll have to wait for the outcome.

The AFA did manage to get their ad on one Australian ‘bus’ - in the Sydney mardi gras. The float ‘bus’ was organised by the Sydney Queer Atheists and sponsored by the Atheist Foundation.

Meanwhile, back in the UK the humanists and atheists raised £100,000 - enough for ads on 800 buses. The message read “There is probably no God - so stop worrying and enjoy life”. Comedy writer Ariane Sherine, creator of the UK campaign, stated in a *Guardian* ‘Comment is Free’ blogpost that it would be a “reassuring alternative to religious slogans threatening non-Christians with hell and damnation.”

In Spain, the ads were a translation of

the UK ad; in Italy they planned to say “The bad news is that God does not exist. The good news is that we do not need him.” But the ad agency pulled out when conservatives objected. In the USA, the American Humanist Association also mounted a bus ad campaign. Their ad read “Why believe in a god? Just be good - for goodness sake”.

So should we be upset by such ads? How should we respond?

In the *war of ideas* everyone can put their perspective. Having the ads on buses actually made people more aware of God than ever!

However, the UK Advertising Standards Authority (ASA) received 150 complaints about the ads, claiming that the campaign was offensive to Christians, and that the “no

God” claim could not be substantiated.

The ASA ruled the ads did not break the advertising code, concluding that the ads were an “expression of the advertiser’s opinion and that the claims in it were not capable of objective substantiation”. As such, it said that it was unlikely to mislead or to cause widespread offence.

Instead of complaining, some Christian groups did the right thing and simply ran counter campaigns on buses. Rev George Hargreaves of the Christian Party created a bus advert which proclaims: “There definitely is a God. So join the Christian Party and enjoy your life.” It ran on 50 bendy buses in central London. The Russian Orthodox Church had 25 supersize bus advertisements, using the line “There IS a God, BELIEVE. Don’t worry and enjoy your life” and the Trinitarian Bible Society had ads saying “The fool hath said in his heart, there is no God. (Psalm 53.1)”.



Complaining about an advertisement

Have you seen an advertisement you think is morally offensive? Next time you see one, please take action!

The Advertising Standards Bureau (ASB) deals with matters covered by their code of ethics: Portrayal of sex/sexuality/nudity; Language; Violence; Health & Safety.

They also deal with complaints about inappropriate advertising to children.

ACTION: How to complain:

First step

Find out the name of the company - look up their details in the telephone directory or on the internet.

Second step

Write to the company about their ad - explain why you think it is objectionable - it could be sexualisation of women or

children, language or violence.

Third step

Write to the Advertising Standards Bureau (ASB). You can make a complaint by post or online.

Complaints **MUST** be in writing, and **MUST** include your postal address.

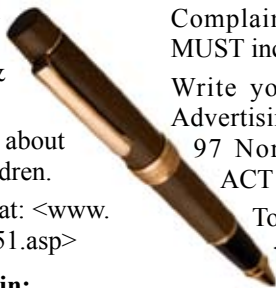
Write your letter and send it to The Advertising Standards Bureau, Level 2, 97 Northbourne Avenue, TURNER ACT 2612.

To make a complaint online, go to <www.adstandards.com.au/pages/screening.asp>

A screening form needs to be completed first to check if the ASB is able to respond to the complaint. The webpage then goes to the complaint form.

So next time you see an offensive ad - Please do something about it!

Queensland: abortion and Emily's List

Bonny Barry, the Queensland ALP MP and Emily's List member who had canvassed the possibility of introducing a private member's bill to decriminalise abortion, lost her seat in the recent Queensland election.

Various pro-life groups and churches campaigned extensively in her electorate of Apsley. There was a swing of 7.5% against her. This compared to an average two party preferred swing of 4.15% against the ALP in all electorates (excluding the four seats held by Independents) - and an average two party preferred swing against Emily's List candidates of 5.25%.

Seven sitting Emily's List members - all in the ALP - sought re-election. Emily's List is the Labor group which supports the election

of women who are in favour of abortion). Six were re-elected. Karen Struthers had a swing of 8.7% against her but as she had a margin of 17.8% she kept her seat. Premier Anna Bligh is a member of Emily's List.

Of the six new ALP candidates endorsed by Emily's List only one was elected - Mary-Anne O'Neill who won the very safe (11% margin) Labor seat of Kallangur despite a swing of 8.7% against her. Leeanne Enoch failed to win the apparently safe Labor seat of Coomera (8.7% margin) which she lost with a 10.7% swing to the LNP.

Hopefully these results will discourage Anna Bligh and her Emily List's colleagues from pursuing legalised abortion in this parliamentary term.

Who is the Master Designer?

When Mandy Thomas, a young woman living near Benalla, read that the local paper was launching a competition for the first young person to write an article for their new 'Spirituality' column, she submitted the following article. Mandy won the prize and the paper printed her article!

Seizing the moment is so important today. No doubt there were all sorts of 'spiritual' people in the area, but by seizing the moment, the Christian message was read by many people.

Have you ever thought about how your car came into being? Of course – somebody intelligent designed it and somebody else made it. It consists of many different components, all put together in a particular way, designed to function efficiently. And most of the time it does. But if one small part fails – say the brakes – you're in a lot of trouble!

In much the same way, the human body is made up of many intricate parts, designed to function as a whole. Take, for example, the eye. It is so much more complex than even the latest camera. Think how many images per second your eyes are looking at (even as you read this) and transmitting to your brain by electrical signals for your brain to process! Your eye has automatic focus and is able to control the amount of light that enters your eye to protect the delicate cells, and many more amazing features which I don't even understand.

Only a master engineer with superior intelligence could design such a complex, interdependent, amazing structure.

Charles Darwin himself once said that

thinking about the complexity of the eye gave him the chills; and wrote: "To suppose that the eye (with so many parts all working together) ... could have been formed by natural selection seems, I freely confess, absurd in the highest degree." He then proceeded to TRY and explain how the eye could have evolved.

The eye is only one small part of the human body – consider all the other complex systems: respiratory, circulatory, digestive, reproductive, etc.

Getting back to the car ... there is no possible way that it could have evolved – it would be crazy to even consider it. So how then could you consider that the eye, the human body, and this whole planet, full of such a variety of life, could possibly have evolved?

It takes so much more faith to believe that we all got here by genetic mutations than that we were designed by a Master Designer. As we see today, genetic mutations lead to problems not improvements of life. (For example – somebody born deaf or blind.) Mutations always

result from a loss of genetic information, rather than an increase of information, proving that evolution is theoretically impossible.

So the question then – Who is the Master Designer? We find the answer in the Bible, which is the world's best and most reliable history book, standing the test of time, and upon which our consciences and morals are based, whether we know it or not, ie: don't murder, don't steal, do to others as you want them to do to you, etc. In Isaiah 45:12, God says, "I have made the earth and created man upon it: I, even my hands, have



stretched out the heavens..." In Genesis, chapter 1, we read the account of how the universe was made by God. Until recently (about 150 years ago) most scientists and scholars believed the Bible's account of origins.

Denise Mountenay is a woman of courage and conviction. We met Denise when she visited Australia last year during the

debate on Victoria's abortion bill and were impressed by her Christian faith and her willingness to speak of her own past in order to help other women.

Denise is the founder of Canada's Silent No More group, which represents women speaking up about the pain and consequences they suffered after having an abortion.

In her book *Forgiven - of murder*, Denise shares her personal story: the trauma of being raped at the age of 13, a teen pregnancy, the pressure to abort, the fear of the unknown.

Using Google for research

The internet has millions of pages of data. It has a good side and a bad side - along with a huge number of Christian sites there is a lot of pornography.

We need to be careful about sourcing information from the net and be very careful about avoiding the wrong sites. However, we should not be afraid of the internet. It is easy to obtain reliable information on a wide range of topics.

Newspaper articles, transcripts of TV and radio interviews such as 7.30 Report and Compass are all readily available. Information on government policies and Inquiries and copies of Hansard are available (along with flight details, book sales, banking etc!). When we first started Salt Shakers the only way to read Hansard was to order printed copies and wade through them when they eventually arrived. Now you can search online the following day!

In a new occasional series, we'll look at how to use the internet effectively for research.

Google News

If you're looking for media articles on a

particular topic, **Google News** makes it very easy to find them all at once. All news items published in media around the world are available for the past 30 days. Plus there is an archive for previous dates.

You might have heard a reference to an item on TV and want to look up ALL the media reports dealing with that subject. A 'normal' Google search (on www.google.com) may find the article - however the search results list all web sources.

To specifically look for recent media articles on a topic just type some key words into Google and click on 'News' (on the top bar). For instance on the recent item on teenage drinking you might type in: teenage drinking Murdoch. Alternatively, if you know the headline from the paper you can type that in.

Then click on 'News' in the top menu bar. The articles are generally shown in a group - you can click on "all x news articles" to see them all.

Why not try it out. . .

Next month: Google Scholar.



Bible and Cross removed from hospital

Sydney's Royal North Shore Hospital recently removed the cross and Bible from the hospital's chapel. They said the chapel is used by all religious groups - and that having a cross in the chapel could offend those of other faiths. The hospital said that specific symbols could be brought to particular services.

Muslims said they weren't upset - but they have already been given a separate, dedicated prayer room by the hospital!

A Catholic priest defied the ban by placing

a cross and a Bible on the altar for Good Friday. Mosman mayor Dominic Lopez said the priest was applauded, as he did his hospital rounds, for standing up to the hospital's ban.

The reaction from church and community leaders has caused the NSW government to call for a review of the ban. The chaplains at the hospital, who had opposed the ban, will meet with a NSW Health chaplaincy advisory committee to consider reinstating the cross and Bible.

UK: Pregnancy, Condoms & Abortion

In 1999 the UK government implemented a range of strategies to try and deal with the growing number of teenage pregnancies.

However, their '*Teenage Pregnancy Strategy*', did not work very well. Official government statistics reveal that the number of girls under the age of 16 becoming pregnant is now the highest it has been in the past decade.

Melanie Phillips, writing in the *Daily Mail*, noted that Labour has spent £300 million (A\$622 million) on trying to reduce teenage pregnancy by handing out contraception and expanding sex education during the past ten years.

She wrote "Labour is doing nothing less than trying to reshape the sexual and moral behaviour of an entire society. In 2007 there were 7,715 conceptions among girls between 13 and 15, who are below the legal age of consent. This was the highest since 1998. Under-16s now account for one in 100 of all pregnancies. Some 8.3 in every 1,000 girls in this age group became pregnant in 2007 - the highest rate since the benchmark year. And in the month that has seen national concern over 13-year-old father Alfie Patten, the figures showed pregnancies among under-14s leapt by nearly 29 per cent from 295 in 2006 to 380 in 2007." [Daily Mail, 27/2/2009]



Abortion

Half of all girls under the age of 18 who become pregnant get an abortion. Now the Advertising Standards Authority (ASA) is planning to allow abortion providers to advertise on British TV for the first time, just to make sure everyone knows how they can obtain an abortion!

The ASA is also proposing allowing condom

manufacturers to advertise at any time of the day or night - currently they can't advertise before 9pm (7.30 pm on Channel 4).

The reason given?

The ASA claims it is helping achieve the government's aim to stop the rising trend of teenage pregnancies. They are currently holding a public consultation into the proposals.

Christian and family groups are unhappy with the proposal. Dr Peter Saunders, of the Christian Medical Fellowship, said: "The problem is that the Government strategy on teenage pregnancy, based on condoms, the morning-after pill and abortion, has failed.

"Allowing the advertising of abortion services is not dealing with the real problem. This is the approach of having the ambulance at the bottom of the cliff to deal with the casualties."

Australia is moving down that track also. Colleagues in Brisbane tell us that abortion clinics have been advertising for some months on the most popular radio stations.

Morning after pill

In another UK program, being trialled in six schools in Oxfordshire, the Government is allowing girls as young as 11 to ask for the morning-after pill by sending a text message to the school nurse! Women are now also allowed to 'bulk buy' the morning-after pill over the internet.

The Conservative Party and Christian ministers rightly say that this programme would encourage promiscuity.

The real solution?

Promoting abstinence before marriage and faithfulness within marriage would be a very good start!

World News

UK: Girl dies after abortion

A UK coroner has criticised abortionists at a Marie Stopes International abortion clinic in Leeds after the death of a 15 year old girl from complications following an abortion. The girl died from a heart attack caused by toxic shock syndrome five days after the abortion. The abortionist had written a prescription for antibiotics but the clinic was criticised for failing to ensure that the girl collected the prescription before leaving. [Lifesite, 27/3/2009]

Finland: Pregnancy & Abortion

A recent study of pregnancy-associated deaths in Finland has shown that the risk of dying within a year after an abortion is several times higher than the risk of dying after miscarriage or childbirth.

The statistical analysis unit of Finland's National Research and Development Centre for Welfare and Health found that women who had abortions were 76% more likely to die in the following year than non-pregnant women. [Lifesite, 27/3/2009]

UK: Teaching Code

Christian groups are concerned about a proposed new 'Code of Conduct and Practice' for teachers in the UK. The General Teaching Council for England (GTCE) released a Draft Code last November and have taken submissions - a report will be published in a few months time.

Concern arises from Principle 4 of the code, "Promote equality and value diversity".

It requires teachers to 'proactively challenge discrimination' and 'promote equality and value diversity in all their professional relationships and interactions' before they can be registered.

It also says teachers have to "Act respectfully

towards all children and young people, parents, carers and colleagues, regardless of their socio-economic background, age, gender, sexual orientation, disability, race, religion or beliefs".

Colin Hart, Christian Institute director, said: "Respect for people as people is not the same as respecting or valuing every religious belief or sexual lifestyle. Forcing this on Christian teachers is to force them to go against their conscience. Teachers are there to teach not to be diversity officers."

UK: Aborted babies and transplants

A scientist in the UK at Oxford University, Professor Richard Gardner, an Oxford University is suggesting that organs such as kidneys and livers from aborted babies should be used as transplant organs. Christian groups said the proposal was immoral and that pressure could be placed on women seeking abortions to 'donate' the organs. [Daily Mail, 11/3/2009]

BBC pushes lesbianism

Channel 7 has its lesbian story line in *Home & Away*, but the BBC have gone one further, they are running two. One on *Eastenders* and now one on *Coronation Street*.

Despite the BBC receiving over 200 complaints about the *Eastenders*' lesbian tryst, they are about to advance rather than retreat.

The *Coronation Street* character is a 16 year old who was a tearaway and then became a "born again Christian" - she is about to get involved in a lesbian relationship.

It is claimed the move is designed to make the programme reflect modern Britain more accurately. Apparently the show's bosses want to create a soap "representative of society in 2009". They say they are aware they need more gay characters and need to tackle more gay issues.

Perhaps they still believe the lie that 10% of society is homosexual or lesbian!

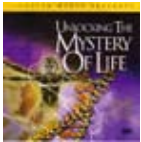
